Mennonite Sale Nets \$2,136.94

The fifth annual Inter-Mennonite Relief Sale held Saturday at Bontrager's Building, drew a large crowd and netted \$2,136.94 for world-wide relief according to Ura B. Yoder, chairman of the sale committee.

"We are thankful to everyone for their giving and response to make this sale the success it was," Yoder said Monday.

Helping him on the sale committee were Willis Yoder and Chris Yoder.

More than 1,050 items went over the auction block with local auctioneers donating their services, helping to get the items sold. At least 500 persons were present at one time during the sale, and it was believed over a 1,000 persons were there sometime during the day.

A hand-made quilt brought \$50. It was purchased by Elwin Yoder of Rockome Gardens. A layer cake brought \$5.50; three pounds of sausage brought \$5 and a loaf of bread, \$2.

The sale began at 10 a. m. and continued through 4 p. m., Yoder said.
